Pinot Noir

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The fruit for our Brocovino Pinot Noir hails from the Tunuyan district of the Uco Valley, arguably the preeminent terroir in Mendoza. The valley's proximity to the Andes mountains provides a mineral laden earthen base and a dramatic range in diurnal temperatures (difference between day and evening readings) resulting in fruit with heightened nuances. The Pinot Noir variety is perfectly suited to this type of environment as evidenced by this expression from a pristinely farmed vineyard. A small amount (15%) of the wine spends a short sojourn in medium toast French oak, adding an element of complexity. Winemaker's notes, "Red and coral subtle colors show bright traces of the great character of this wine, later confirmed at sipping. In the nose, the first impression is that of a basket of ripen cherries, crispy but somehow still nicely acidic. When sipping, the cherry taste is lighter and hints of a barely toasted bread becomes apparent, expressing the light contact with French oak, while a juicy acidity and a long finish will push you to enjoy another glass."
